


Jimmy Alfredo Mordan, born February 2, 1987 is a Dominican American singer and songwriter. Born and raised in the Dominican Republic, he is the son of Jaime Mordan, an Automotive Repair Shop owner, and Eneuroaliza De Los Santos Mordan a Hair Salon worker. At a very young age, Jimmy found a passion for music and dancing. He soon began participating and competing in talent shows which boosted his confidence to pursue a new yet uncertain future in the music industry. "Jaimito", like many of his close friends and family call him migrated to the United States at the age of seventeen, where he soon would find himself in love for the first time.
